For 27 years now we have been holding our Annual Food Drive in June to raise food, funds and awareness for our neighbors who suffer from food insecurity. Summer is typically a tough time for families due to the loss of school provided meals, and 2020 was like a year-long summer! More families visited our food pantry for the first time in 2020 than ever before. There was an estimated 300% increase in first time clients! This year we held our food & essentials drive at Shaw's Supermarket on West Boylston St. Staff and volunteers were there in person on June 12th & 13th raising awareness and collecting food & monetary donations. 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We also want to thank all those who donated food and toiletries to our satellite collection boxes at both Worcester Price Choppers on Cambridge St. & Park Ave. All told, we collected a total of 2,000 lbs. of food and essential items during our week long drive. Due to their contributions and the individual donations of so many online and by mail, we were able to raise nearly \$18,000!! This has been one of the most successful drives to date. 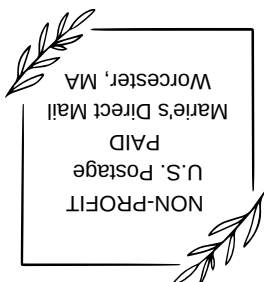
